Manitoba:

The operator of an indoor public place must ensure that every person who is not wearing a mask while in the indoor public place is given a reminder to do so as soon as possible following entry. In addition, employees, contractors, or operators of an indoor public place do not need to wear a mask while they are in an area where members of the public do not normally have access, or if they are behind a non-permeable physical barrier, including a plexiglass barrier.

People can temporarily remove their mask while in an indoor public place:

to receive a service that requires the removal of their mask,

to consume food or drink.

to deal with an emergency or medical purpose, or

to establish their identity.

People who do not have to wear masks include:

a child who is under five years of age.

a person with a medical condition that is unrelated to COVID-19, including breathing or cognitive difficulties or a disability, which prevents them from safely wearing a mask.

a person who is swimming or engaged in other athletic activities; and

a person who is unable to put on or remove a mask without the assistance of another person.
